
Make a Worry Dolls with Pegs

Children in Central America make worry dolls and tell their troubles to the doll. They make one doll for each worry they have and place each doll under their pillow and go to sleep. While they sleep the dolls solve their worries.

To make a worry doll you will need

A wooden peg
A lollypop stick
Some coloured wool
Scissors
PVA glue
Felt tip pen / marker pen





Mark the middle of the lollypop stick and break or cut in half. Glue the arms to the side of the peg and leave to dry. You can secure with tape while drying to keep the arms in place and then gently remove tape once dry.

Draw a face onto the top of the peg. Then take your coloured wool and start wrapping around the doll from the neck down. Keep wrapping until the doll is covered in wool. If you want the doll to wear trousers then wrap each leg separately, then cut the wool and glue down the end. If you want to use two different colours of wool for the top and bottom of the doll then after making the top cut the wool and knot the end to your next colour.

Finally put some glue on the head and fix some wool to the head to make hair and leave to dry. Your worry doll is now ready for you to tell your problems to.

Using a shoe lace, glue stick, card and a hole-punch cut out the large heart and glue it to the card. Punch holes around the heart. Take the shoe lace and knot one end, and then try to thread the other end through the holes.
